Established in 1958 as the Wilson Industrial Extension Center, Wilson Community College is one of the oldest institutions in the North Carolina Community College System. In 1964, the State Board of Education granted authority to award the Associate in Applied Science Degree and the school name was changed to Wilson County Technical Institute. The College was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in 1969 and the name was officially changed to Wilson Technical Community College in 1989. In 1993, the State Department of Community Colleges granted the College authority to award the Associate in Arts degree and in 2007, the official name of the College was changed to Wilson Community College (WCC) to better reflect the full range of programs and services offered.

Wilson Community College's mission focuses on providing "opportunities for academic excellence, student success, workforce development, community partnerships, and responsible stewardship." WCC subscribes to the open-door

admissions policy established by the North Carolina Community College System and State Board of Community Colleges. All applicants who have earned a high school diploma or equivalent, or are at least 18 years of age and able to profit from formal education, are served by the institution. Allied Health programs are subject to program-specific admission criteria.

Wilson Community College is located at 902 Herring Avenue, in Wilson, North Carolina. The College serves Wilson County, which has a population of approximately 78,294.

In the academic year 2021-2022, the unduplicated enrollment of the College was 5,641 consisting of curriculum and continuing education (non-credit) students. During the 2021-2022 academic year, 23% of WCC students were enrolled full-time, with the remaining 77% of students attending part-time. The racial composition of the student body was comprised of 31% African American, 48% Caucasian, and 12% Hispanic. Fifty percent (2,812) of the student body is male, and 50% (2,829) female.
